NEWS Letter from the Chief Executive



To all new volunteers that have joined us in 2018, we extend a very warm welcome and we hope you have settled in, and are enjoying your volunteering experience.

I know we have said this before but it is still as true today as it ever was, and that is that ESAB simply would not exist without the help of our wonderful volunteers. In whatever your role out in the community or at head office, you really do make a huge difference to the lives of our members, and your support is greatly appreciated.

To highlight some figures, our outreach vehicle service volunteer drivers help us connect with around 400 people a year, our social group organisers, helpers, and drivers help up to 500 members combat isolation and loneliness every month, and our home visitor volunteers provide one to one befriending support to around 58 members both in the city of Brighton and Hove and

across rural East Sussex.

ANNUAL DONATION

A big 'thank you' to you all

Two years we launched our annual donation request and we are very grateful to all of you who made contributions to our work. What is Gift Aid?
